



Dressage & Western Dressage High Percentage Awards Degree of Difficulty

Degree of difficulty points (see chart below) will be added to each percentage score to determine the High Percentage Champions and Reserve Champions.

LEVEL	PERCENTAGE POINTS ADDED
Introductory	0
Training 1 & 2/Basic 1 & 2	1
Training 3/Basic 3 & 4	2
First 1 & 2/Level One 1 & 2	3
First 3/Level One 3 & 4	4
Second 1 & 2/Level Two 1 & 2	5
Second 3/Level Two 3 & 4	6
Third 1 & 2/Level Three 1 & 2	7
Third 3/Level Three 3 & 4	8
Fourth 1 & 2/Level Four 1 & 2	9
Fourth 3/Level Four 3 & 4	10
Small Tour (PSG, I1)/Level Five	11
Medium Tour (IA, IB)	12
Large Tour (I2, GP)	13

For example:

Introductory B scores 72% → 0 points added = 72%

Training Level Test 3 scores 68% → 2 points added = 70%

Second Level Test 1 scores 66% → 5 points added = 71%

The Introductory B test would be Champion, and the Second Level test would be Reserve Champion.

In the event of a tie, the higher average collective scores will prevail. If scores remained tied, the highest single collective score determines the winner. Should a tie still remain, the judge will decide.
